Enter your reflective comments	2019 has seen growth in building practice excellence through the development of reading and writing instructional models based on best practice and professional learning to unpack the components of the model. Regular classroom observations and learning walks have ensured the model is embedded in practice.  The PLC training for middle leaders and its implementation across the school in semester 2 using the inquiry cycle has enabled teachers to work collaboratively at the school level to improve student outcomes with an improved focus on data. 2019 has set the scene for future growth in student learning through increased consistency and expectations across the school and clear focus on AIP goals.
Considerations for 2020	In 2020 we will continue to embed the writing instructional model with a particular focus on utilising data to differentiate teaching within the structure of the Instructional Model. This will include setting and monitoring individual writing goals for students, use of formative assessment and effective conferencing of writing. Professional learning, learning walks and peer observations will support and monitor staff capacity to implement the instructional model.  2020 will also see the introduction of a Numeracy instructional model based on the work done in 2019 on the writing model. SWPBS will continue to be an important focus to ensure consistency across the school and increase time spend on

	learning. A document attendecne strategy will be a priority to ensure students are at school regularly and on time to maximize learning student acheivemnent.
